



### Student Laptop Requirements and IT Support Policy

### Laptop Requirements

Students are required to bring a Macintosh laptop with the following minimum system requirements:

- OS X 11.0 or higher
- Intel Core i5, Core i7 OR Apple M1 chip or newer
- 8 GBb RAM
- 256 GB SSD Hard Drive (or more)

### Technical Support

Wasatch Academy IT staff does not provide technical support for student computers, phones, or other personal devices. Students are responsible for maintaining a working, virus-free computer. If laptop repair or technical support is needed, students should consult with their parent or guardian, and mail-in repairs can be arranged with Apple Support (support.apple.com). Students may also consult with the Wasatch Academy Student Store about local computer repair options.

The Wasatch Academy IT department maintains a limited number of laptops that can be loaned out to students temporarily for use while a personal laptop is being repaired. These laptops are issued by request and are subject to availability. The laptops can be checked out and returned at the WA Student Store.

### Software and Data

Some classes may require software not included with a current Macintosh laptop and/or not available via the web (SaaS). In these cases, software licensing or lab computers will be made available to the student by the academy. Students are responsible for backing up their data. For backup and storage of important files, it is recommended that students bring a portable memory device with sufficient storage capacity. Also, each student has cloud storage available through their Wasatch Academy Google Drive account.

### Email and Internet

Students are given a school email address. Announcements, activities, and other information are communicated via the school email. Students are expected to check this account frequently. Wasatch Academy provides a campus-wide wireless network for student use. Each student is given a unique username and password to the student wireless network. The student wireless network shuts off nightly. Wired Ethernet connections are not available for student use.



### **Student Dress Expectations**

Our students must always be properly covered, neat, clean, and consistent with Wasatch Academy values. Please note that Dorm Parents, Faculty, and Staff are empowered to make final decisions regarding the appropriateness of dress. If students are asked to change, they are expected to comply immediately.

### **Dress Expectations**

- Clothing and shoes in good repair.
- Sweaters, khakis, slacks, chinos, jeans, woven athletic pants, hoodies, collared shirts, and knit tops.
- Mid-thigh length shorts, skirts, and dresses.
- No offensive graphics.

### Piercings and Other Body Modifications

If your child has any body piercings, please note that a single nose piercing is allowed. For medical reasons, self-piercings and self-tattooing are not permitted. This also pertains to the piercing or tattooing of other students. Such choices may result in disciplinary action.

### Formal Wear - Required for Advisory Dinner, Prom in Spring, and Commencement

When formal dress is required, tasteful choices of slacks, dresses, sports coats, ties, skirts, business casual shirts, and the like are appropriate. While jeans and sports shirts are not permitted, suits and formal gowns are not necessary. Athletic footwear is not appropriate when formal dress is required. There is a formal dinner in December and Prom in the Spring. Commencement is also a formal event for seniors.



RE: Prescriptions, Medications, Vitamins, and Supplements

Dear Wasatch Academy Families,

The Wellness Center is excited to care for and ensure the health and well-being of your student while enabling them to learn and grow at Wasatch Academy.

Please know that students are not permitted to have medications, including vitamins, supplements, prescription medications, or over-the-counter medications, in their possession or dorm rooms. While attending Wasatch Academy, these medications will be distributed through the Wellness Center. In order to provide the best care, we ask that you follow these simple guidelines pertaining to medications and supplements:


- Please do not send over-the-counter (OTC) medications with your student to school for
  occasional use. The Wellness Center has most of these medications in stock at all times.
  However, if there is a particular OTC medication your student needs to take regularly, it is
  the parent's responsibility to provide the medication to the Wellness Center. We will then
  distribute OTC medications as needed.
- Please do not send supplements, oils, vitamins, enzymes, proteins, etc., with your student to
  school unless your child will be taking them on a daily basis. Should your student need a
  supplement, please consider a multi-vitamin/mineral combination that can be easily
  purchased and is approved for distribution in the United States. It is the parent's
  responsibility to purchase and supply the daily supplement or vitamin, and we encourage
  you to send a four-month minimum supply.
- If your student requires prescription medication, they must be stabilized on the current prescription medication regimen prior to arrival on campus. To support the ongoing administration of their medication, we ask that the prescription medication has the maximum number of refills permitted by their doctor, if possible, and arrive at campus with at least a full month's supply. All prescriptions are filled at a local pharmacy in Mt. Pleasant, Utah. If your student will need refills of their prescription, please contact the pharmacy with your health insurance information and credit card for them to keep on file for refills. Once again, medication costs and refills are the parents' responsibility. Should your student need a new prescription or a medication refill, the Wellness Center may purchase the prescription with the payment card on file at the pharmacy (preferred method). Or the student may pay for the medication with their own debit/credit card. RE: Health Insurance

Dear Wasatch Academy Parents,

Illness, injuries, and health emergencies can occur at any time. To ensure quality care and coverage, health insurance is mandatory for all students who attend Wasatch Academy. Wasatch Academy Wellness Center must have a current copy of your insurance card or certificate on file at all times. Students who reside in the United States, please send a copy of your insurance card (front and back) directly to the Wellness Center. This can be emailed, faxed, or mailed.

If you are an international student and need to purchase insurance, we ask that you use <u>GeoBlue International Health Insurance</u>. <u>GeoBlue</u> is an insurance company designed for international students, is contracted with Wasatch Academy, and is accepted and billable by clinics and hospitals in our area. Beginning August 1, 2023, the rate of <u>GeoBlue International Health Insurance</u> will increase slightly to \$160.05 per month and must be purchased before the student's arrival. Parents are responsible for the cost of insurance, as it is not included in the cost of tuition. You can find the link to our group plan to purchase online here.

If your international student arrives without health insurance coverage, the Wasatch Academy Wellness Center will purchase nine months of insurance for your student and bill it to their student account. As parents, you will be responsible for this cost, along with any other medical charges. If you have questions regarding health insurance or GeoBlue coverage, please contact the Wellness Center.

Co-pays, medication costs, and services not covered by health insurance are the parents' responsibility, and billings will be sent directly to your address. If there is a change in your insurance policy during the year, please notify the Wellness Center promptly so we can update our records. As we are all aware, anything can happen at any time, and we want to be able to care for your child without delay.

### Financial Payment Arrangements and Options

The Basic Enrollment Fee includes the cost of academic Tuition, Room and Board (for boarding students), Class Fees, and any other required Enrollment fees. These fees are contracted for the year and payable as follows:

- ✓ **Enrollment Deposit:** The student's parent(s) or legal guardian must sign this Enrollment Contract and submit a <u>non-refundable</u> \$10,000 deposit to secure the student's enrollment at the school. This deposit will be applied as the initial payment toward the Basic Enrollment Fee.
- ✓ **Primary payment plan:** The balance of the Basic Enrollment Fee is due and payable on or before July 1st.
- ✓ Alternative payment plan: 40% of the Basic Enrollment Fee must be paid on or before July 1st, with subsequent monthly payments due the 1st of each month, with the last payment due on or before December 1st. This payment plan requires the purchase of the Tuition Refund Plan, which costs 5% of the Tuition, Room, and Board fee, less the non-refundable deposit. Past-due payments beyond December may incur an interest charge of 12% per annum.

The School has many fixed expenses, among them faculty salaries and campus maintenance. In order to plan and maintain these services over the entire year, it is essential that the revenues from the fees be assured. For this reason, it is understood that the students are enrolled for the entire school year (or such portion as may remain after the date of enrollment). Therefore, it is the school's policy that no reduction or refund of fees is allowed for absence, withdrawal, or dismissal.



### Financial Payment Arrangements and Options continued

### <u>Payment Options – International Students</u>

For international students, Wasatch Academy has partnered with PayMyTuition, which allows international families to pay tuition and fees from any country, any bank, and in any currency, while saving money on currency exchange rates and transfer fees. *It is recommended that payments be sent at least 72 business hours before the due date.*

### **Tuition Refund Plan**

Virtually all independent schools require full payment of tuition and other fees for the entire academic year as stated in the catalog and enrollment contract. Independent school expenses are incurred on an annual basis and schools cannot refund charges paid or forgive unpaid obligations in the event a student leaves during the academic year. Wasatch Academy requires full payment of tuition and fees for the entire academic year, regardless of whether a student withdraws during the year.

However, to alleviate in part the financial difficulties caused when a student withdraws before the academic year has been completed, Wasatch Academy has a Tuition Refund Plan available. Parents must sign up and pay for the Tuition Refund Plan at the time of enrollment. Parents who elect not to participate in the Tuition Refund Plan will not receive any refund upon early withdrawal or dismissal of their student.

For purposes of the Tuition Refund Plan, the Basic Fee is defined as the annual charge made for tuition, room and board less the required non-refundable deposit.

#### Plan Cost

The cost of the Tuition Refund Plan is 5% of the Basic Fee as defined above, payable upon enrollment.

#### Plan Benefits

Subject to the exceptions set forth below, in the event the student withdraws or is dismissed prior to the end of the year, the Plan will refund 50% of a prorated portion of the Basic Fee if the student elects to withdraw or the student is dismissed. The amount of the refund will be calculated as follows:

### Refund= Number of days left in the school year x Basic Fee x .5 Number of days in the schoolyear

This Plan does not apply to and no refund is available for any fee charged by Wasatch Academy other than the Basic Fee as defined above.

All outstanding charges owed to Wasatch Academy will be deducted from any refund due under the Plan before payment is made. In addition, where a withdrawal or dismissal falls within the exceptions set forth below, no refund will be made even though the parent has elected to participate in the Tuition Refund Plan.

### Exceptions

No refund is allowed for any absence or early withdrawal or dismissal due to:

- 1. The use or possession by the student of alcohol or any drug, narcotic or an agent which is similarly classed or has similar effects unless given by and while under the care of a legally qualified medical practitioner,
- 2. Actions by the student that might endanger other students, faculty, staff, or school property,
- 3. Intentionally self-inflicted injuries,
- 4. Boycotting of classes by the student,
- 5. Closure of the school or inability to operate caused partially or wholly, directly or indirectly, by fire, flood, earthquake, elements of nature or acts of God, acts of war or terrorism, labor strikes, civil disorders, acts of governmental or judicial authorities, government-imposed shutdown and/or delay, pandemic, epidemic, public health care crises, quarantine or other disease control measures,
- 6. Destruction of any school facility due to any cause whatsoever,
- 7. Inability of the school to operate and provide formal academic instruction, including closure for any reason, or
- $\textbf{8.} \quad \textbf{Student being inducted or drafted into the Armed Forces including alternative duty as a conscientious objector.}$

In addition, no refund is available for a withdrawal or absence from class attendance for the balance of the academic year due to early completion of academic requirements or early graduation, a student's temporary absence or suspension; or a change from resident to day status.



### **Ancillary Expenses**

Wasatch Academy encourages families to provide a debit card for their student. The School has observed many students using debit cards that allow parents to place limits on their child's spending and see up-to-date information on purchases. If your bank doesn't offer a debit card designed to support your student, a quick Google search yields several debit cards that will.

For some families, particularly international families, debit or credit cards may not be available for their student. The School can provide a student with a pre-paid debit card, that is funded by the student's family. The downside of this arrangement is that parents aren't able to track student purchases.

#### Student Fees

The School has consolidated expenses into the following fees:

### All Students:

• Classroom resource fee - \$500

#### All Boarding Students:

- Laundry fee \$95 (this fee allows the students to use the washer/dryers that are owned by a third-party vendor. This eliminates the need to put quarters in the machine).
- Transportation fee \$500 (we are eliminating the need to charge for each individual trip to the airport, doctor's office, etc. This fee will cover all trips needed during the school year)

**Juniors** – \$700 to cover the cost of the junior class trip down either the Green River or the Colorado River.

**Seniors** - \$550 to cover the cost of a senior experience and graduation.

### Optional Fees:

- Snow Sports
- Equestrian
- AP testing fees
- TOEFL testing fees



### Ancillary Expenses continued

Other fees or charges are unusual. If the School encounters unusual charges, it will communicate with the family before charging fees. Some examples of unusual charges are dorm room damage, homestays, keycard replacement, and other items.

There have been times when the School has purchased items to meet the immediate need of the student. Some examples are health insurance premiums for international students, baggage fees, unaccompanied minor fees, ski rentals, ACT or SAT registration fees, Doctor visits, prescription medication, etc. It is the hope of the School that either parents or students can pay for these types of items directly. However, if that isn't practical, the School may pay for these items and seek reimbursement.
